SEARCH TIPS

Browse the Classification for Fashion, Costume and Jewelry, and then narrow by country name

Browse museums with encyclopedic collections (e.g. *The Metropolitan Museum of Art* or *Philadelphia Museum of Art*) and select the category for Costume

Keyword search for individual designers (e.g. Chanel), or types of clothing and accessories (e.g. dress, hat, etc.)

DID YOU KNOW?

Magnum Photos, the world-renowned cooperative of photojournalists, has shared approximately 80,000 images documenting historical events, contemporary life, and notable personalities of the 20th century. These include portraits of fashion designers such as Coco Chanel, Christian Lacroix, Karl Lagerfeld, Jeanne Lanvin, Sonia Rykiel, and Yves Saint-Laurent. The Magnum photographs may also be studied as visual documentation of changing fashion trends over the decades, whether the iconic style of figures like Jacqueline Kennedy or Audrey Hepburn, or the everyday attire of ordinary people. Magnum photographers also provide coverage of contemporary fashion with selected runway shows during recent fashion weeks in Paris, Milan, and New York. These photographs capture designers and models, both on the catwalk and behind the scenes.
